



## **All Saints Laxfield Primary School – PE and Sport Premium Plan – 2025-26**

### **Introduction**

The PE Premium funding provides an excellent opportunity for the school to further improve its PE provision and to do so in the wider context of the Schools Sport Partnership, fully utilising the skills and experience across the group of schools.

### **School Vision and Aims**

Our vision and long term aims for the development of high quality physical education and physical activity at All Saints Primary:

*Through the delivery of high quality PE and an increased level of sports available for the children to participate in out of school hours, every child will leave our school enthused, motivated and inspired to continue participating in sports.*

### **Key objectives**

In order for All Saints to achieve and maintain our vision we will focus on the following areas:

- Pupils have high quality PE lessons in school.
- Pupils have access to a planned programme of high quality intra and inter-school sports competitions across the year. School Games Mark level achieved.
- Access to coaching and specialist teachers and sports leaders from secondary schools.
- PE Leader attends School Games and Trust quarterly meetings and plans and co-ordinates activities alongside sports co-ordinator/school games coordinator.
- Planning and delivery of PE across the school is of consistently high quality, through up-skilled staff and the pupil's skills will be developed to a higher standard.
- Through sport coaches we deliver clubs to increase the level of participation by the pupils in sports and keeping active and healthy related activities.
- Increase structured physical activity during school and at playtimes and lunchtimes.
- Improve pupils' mental health and wellbeing through being outdoors, through gardening, playing and being active.
- Ensure pupils can enjoy cycling and be safe cyclists.
- Ensure pupils can meet the DfE's swimming requirements by the end of Year 6.
- Provide outdoor physical activities for EYFS.
- Highlight the importance of physical activity and healthy living.
- Provide and develop playground facilities and areas which give pupils the chance to be active, reflective or sociable at break and lunchtimes.

<p>School Sports Partnership subscription.</p> <p>Release time for staff and transport costs for pupils to attend and take part in School Games events. Aim for Sainsbury's School Games Silver Mark.</p>	<p>The school has entered 7 School Games events this year provided by through the School Sports Partnership. Events attended included, cross country, tag rugby, multiskills, tennis, gymnastics, athletics and rounders.</p> <p>Sainsbury's School Games Silver Mark achieved.</p>
<p>CPD opportunities to upskill staff</p>	<p>PE lead attended a PE subject leaders workshop and AfPE Safe Practice workshop.</p>
<p>Employ teaching assistants to provide activities for active lunchtimes.</p>	<p>The additional adult was able to initiate, organise and lead games for children at lunchtimes that meant they were actively engaged in play and being active.</p>
<p>Provide places for after school club for identified pupils</p>	<p>Children who would benefit from after school club were able to attend – this impacted positively on their mental health and wellbeing.</p>
<p>Develop grassed area of playground into useable space in winter including equipment</p>	<p>The plans for the new area were drafted and agreed. Unfortunately, there have been delays with quotations which we are still waiting on and additional funding has had to be sourced.</p>
<p>Provide enrichment days and specialist coaches for sports we are unable to deliver in school.</p>	<p>We had an Olympic Dance workshop and Jamie Knight, a football freestyler in school. These days were thoroughly enjoyed by all children and were particularly inspirational for children we least expected to enjoy them.</p>
<p>Whole school trip to Whitlingham Adventure</p>	<p>This enabled all children to take part in two or three activities which the majority had never done before. All children took part in a water sport, such as sailing, paddleboarding, canoeing, raft building or katakanuing. Land based activities included team building, archery and orienteering.</p>
<p>Renew and replace PE resources for GETSET4PE scheme of work</p>	<p>Resources for delivery of golf lessons were purchased, including clubs, tees and balls. Hockey balls and shin pads were purchased to ensure safe delivery of hockey lessons. A replacement basketball unit was purchased as well as some new resources for sports day (quoits and sacks).</p>



Part subsidise residential trips in year 4,5,6 for some children to enable them to attend.	All pupils were able to attend the residentials, to Horstead and Hilltop, which are both outward bound activity centres.
Provide Bikeability cycle training for Year 6 so they can be cycle safely and lead active lifestyles	85% of Year 5 pupils passed Bikeability. 100% of children got their bronze certificate.
Extra swimming sessions to meet DfE requirement for year 6 to swim 25m by end of Primary School	Extra spaces were provided for swimming that enabled those who attended to swim 25m.
Funding for equipment checks, playground and field markings to be painted,	These were carried out and enabled pupils to use the equipment and partake in sports day, football, etc. Remedial work was carried out where needed.
